The fact that Doug was an Olympian and that Carol won the Senior Women's high jump at Senior Nationals at the young age of 18. It made sense to me then that Carol was always the top official at the High Jump and Doug was the Track Referee.

But the story did not end there as I was also informed that these two amazing athletes/coaches/officials had also started the Caltaf Club back in 1958. He was the one I relied on. Of course, when I chaired the 2011 & 2012 Nationals, I reached out to Doug for his expertise and knowledge. I would have to say that we became friends over that project together. Every year since then I have looked for Doug at every track meet in Calgary. Even this past year, he was my track referee for the indoor Dino series and of course the 2023 Caltaf Classic. I was so happy to see Doug and his family run/walk down the Foothills track for what would be Doug's last stroll. I cried at the finish line and could not get my words out to thank him for all he has done for our sport. I had to rely on Jason Lindsay to help me out with that one.

I will never forget the generosity of the Kyle family, allowing me to get to know Doug at the track. I have to say that I saw him, even this past summer, over at Glenmore Track timing his laps as he pushed his walker around the track. He was an inspiration to the athletes I was there working with, realizing that the gentleman timing his laps was Doug Kyle, Olympian, Builder and #1 Supporter of Athletics in our City.

Goodbye Doug. Until we meet again and can both run laps together...

2023 Officials' AGM

Our Athletics Alberta Officials' AGM was held May 2, 2023 (as a Zoom meeting). 38 officials participated in this session. Meeting minutes are posted in the Officials' Section of the AA website.

The following items were some of the matters dealt with at this meeting.

Officials' Committee Structure

Changes have been made to the structure of our Athletics Alberta Officials' Committee.

The Calgary Coordinator and Medicine Hat Coordinator positions have been combined and renamed as the South Coordinator.

The Edmonton Coordinator(s) position was renamed to the North Coordinator(s).

The Level 1 & Level 2 Upgrading position has been combined with the Level 3 Upgrading position and redesignated as the Level 1, 2 & 3 Upgrading Coordinator.

A new position, **Administrative Coordinator**, has been created on the Committee. This position is responsible for administering the online Officials Management System and assisting (where required) the zone coordinators with the designation of the various meet officials' assignments. They will also (along with the Chair) set up the required Level 3 Clinics for each area. The Administrative Coordinator will also be responsible for recording the minutes of our meetings and preparing a report semi-annually for the Officials' Committee.

Canadian 2023 Track & Field Championships



Nationals in Langley – July 26-30, 2023 - Mihaela Cozma

For the second time in Langley, I had the opportunity to be part of the 100+ team of officials and work with a great team of BC and AB Officials in running the Call Room for the Canadian Track and Field Championship. As a CR Chief, I've seen the "behind the scenes" of a large competition, I've seen all the 1,956 individual entries, 51 being for decathlon and 33 for heptathlon, signed more than 500 heat sheets, spent on average 15 hours at the stadium per day, changed three pairs of shoes, not complained about being in the scorching sun, and watched live about 2 minutes of the entire competition.

I was impressed by how much goes around at every single time during this big competition on all fronts, and how invested everyone was from organizers, to officials, to volunteers to run everything smooth and without hick-ups.

My take always from this experience: work with the team and get the best of everyone in the team, be ready to deal with the unexpected and be flexible in the course of action, communicate clearly with the athletes and be sure the message was understood, know the expectations as communicated in the competition manual (even if that means there are deviations from the norm – i.e., advertising on competition attire, what's allowed or not allowed in the competition area), communicate with the entire system to create the best conditions for the athletes to perform (photo finish, start line, referees for delay in the events, changes in the schedule, changes on the heat sheets), know the rules and apply them when appropriate (for the entire competition, there was only one protest for a DQ decision in the CR), and the most important thing – have some fun!

Safe Sport Training

Officials need to take Safe Sport training. It is **FREE** and is available in the **"Become an Official"** section of the AA website.

As sports in general become aware of Safe Sport principles, it is important to reiterate the importance of understanding what it means for us to have a *safe sport*.

The Coaching Association of Canada, on the FAQ section of its website, has a comprehensive list of those required to take Safe Sport training. That information is provided below.

As of April 1, 2020, anyone in any of the following roles within a Sport Canada-funded organization must be trained on conduct to prevent and address maltreatment:

Decision-makers

- Senior staff
- High-performance directors
- Case managers
- Adjudicators
- Investigators
- Operational Board members

Those with direct athlete contact

- National team athletes
- Parents of junior athletes
- Coaches
- High-performance staff
- National training centre staff
- Nationally appointed coach Developers
- Integrated support team personnel (mental, strength and conditioning, nutrition, physio, massage, etc.)
- Contractors
- Officials

Those with no direct athlete contact

- Organizing committee members
- Administration/finance staff
- Governance committee members
- Judicial board members
- Governance board members (no operational involvement)
- Event volunteers
- NSO office staff

The training is the first part in Safe Sport. Putting the training into practice is what's paramount to our Athletes and our sport.



Athletics Alberta is committed to ensuring all of our members feel safe when participating in our sport. If you feel unsafe (physically, emotionally, mentally) the Whistleblower Policy is how you let us know in a confidential way.

World Athletics Technical Rule Amendments

In May 2023 World Athletics amended Technical Rule **TR20.4.2** which governs the placement of athletes (**after the first round**) in lanes for straight races, 200m, 400m (plus relays up to and including 4X400m) & 800m events. The revised lane assignments are as set out in the chart below.

World Athletics also amended **TR6.4.5** which now reads as follows: **6.4.5** -Viewing by athletes competing in Field Events, of images of previous trial(s), recorded on their behalf by persons not placed in the competition area (see Note to Rule 6.1 of the Technical Rules). The viewing device or images taken from it must not be taken into the competition area beyond the immediate area in which those providing the recording are placed. To ensure a better view of the images, the athlete may hold the device whilst communicating with the persons who have taken the images.
